The website www.thethread.org.uk is a central hub to find out about events and activities throughout the region featuring local news, views, music and entertainment. Highlights from the website's listings guide are emailed to over 9,000 subscribers each fortnight featuring key news and events as an e-Thread.

The Thread also boasts a weekly 'What's On' page in the weekly Macclesfield Express which features highlights of events & activities for the week ahead.

Canalside Community Radio launched the Canalside's 'The Thread' 102.8FM at the end of 2012 to spread the word on the airwaves. The station aims to bring you more of your favourite music, mixed with community and specialist programming.
